## PROGRAM

Learn about healing in a cross-cultural perspective in the vibrant country of Tanzania! This program will introduce students to the culture and healthcare environment of two towns in Tanzania - Iringa and Dar es Salaam. During the program, pre-health and anthropology students will encounter patients whose health problems may result from the environment in which they exist. Students will engage in real world tasks that will hopefully transform them as they work to be future physicians.

## LOCATION

Tanzania is an East African country situated just south of the equator. The country, where some of the oldest remnants of human life are said to have been found, has a long and complex history. Officially the United Republic of Tanzania, the country was formed through the union of Tanganyika on the African mainland and the island of Zanzibar in 1964. Modern Tanzania's population is now comprised of a plethora of African people groups, as well as Asian and European minority groups, which speaks to its cultural diversity. The country is also home to a variety of natural wonders, including the world's highest free-standing mountain peak, Mount Kilimanjaro, and the Serengeti plains.

## EXCURSIONS

Excursions will include but are not limited to: a Game Drive in Ruhua National Park, Iringa Boma Museum, National Museum House of Culture, and Neema Crafts.

### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Open to students in the UF Honors Program on a pre-health path
- Priority will be given to students pursuing a credential in Anthropology
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- Must be in good standing

### PRICING

#### 2024 Undergraduate Program Fee: \$6,166

A \$395 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is due at the time of application. The remaining fees are due no later than 45 days prior to departure. If you receive financial aid, you can defer payment until it disburses. Deferment decisions will be based on the amount of aid to be received.

### WHAT'S INCLUDED

Tuition for 6 credits, housing, excursions, some meals, transportation to different locations, international health insurance, and emergency medical assistance.

### WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED

Round-trip airfare, tourist visa, mandatory vaccinations, some meals, additional personal travel, and personal expenses.

### FINANCIAL AID

Most financial aid that you would receive on campus can be applied toward the cost of this program. However, all financial aid eligibility is determined by Student Financial Aid & Scholarships.
